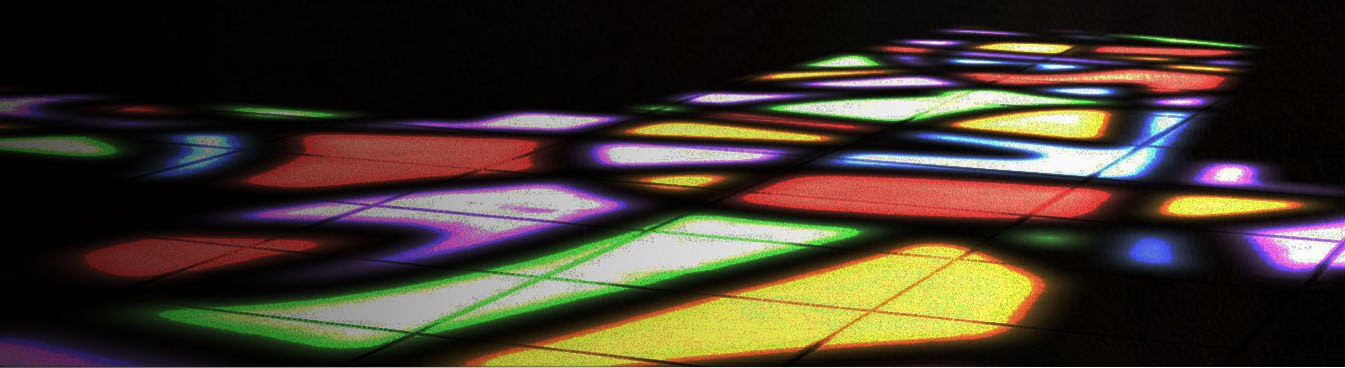
Stress In The Garden

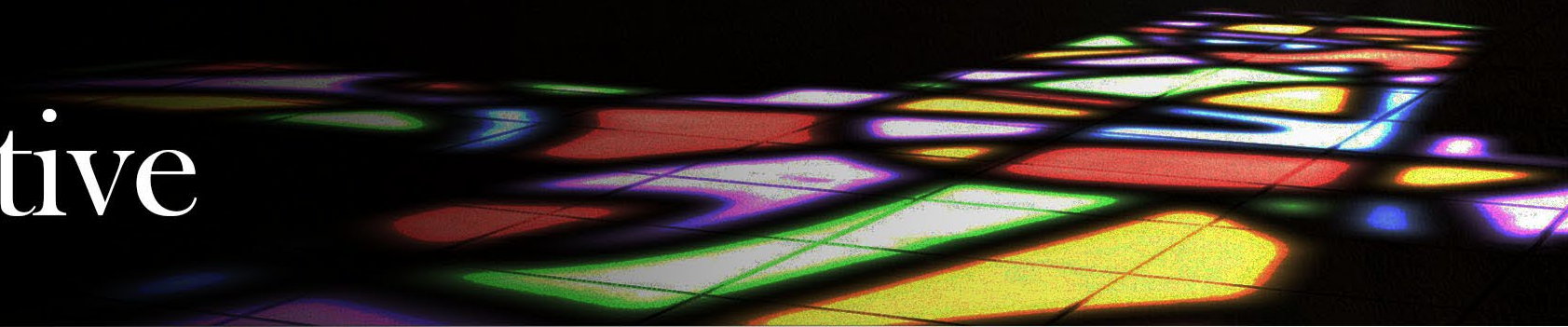
He Died For Our Sake

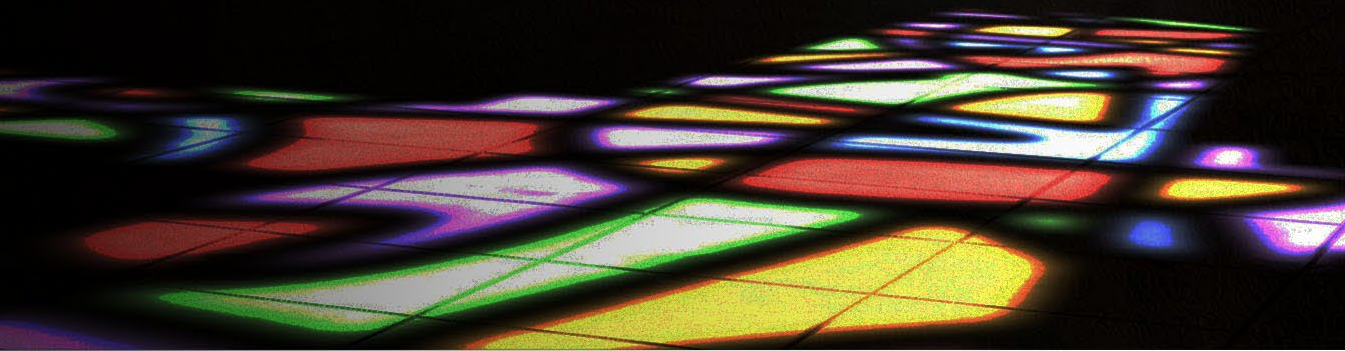
He Died For Our Sake
