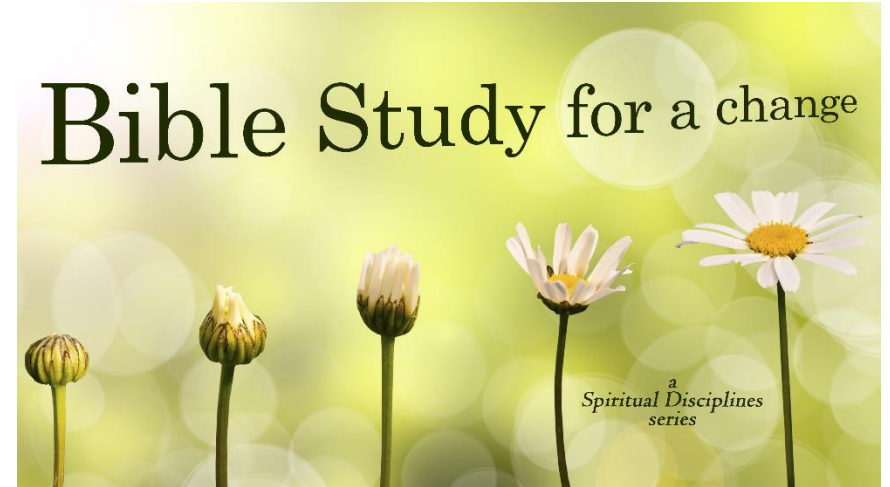

Disciplined Study

Observation

What does it say? (let the text speak for itself)

- Pray
- Identify the Context
- Observe Obvious
- Deal with the Text Objectively
- Read with a Purpose
 - o Who?
 - o What?
 - o When?
 - o Where?
 - o Why?
 - o How?

Interpretation

What does it mean? (there is only one interpretation)

- Context Rules
- Seek the Full Counsel of the Word of God
- Scripture will never contradict Scripture
- Don't base Doctrine on an Obscure Passage
- Interpret Scripture Literally (Literarily)
- Look for the Author's Intended Meaning
- Check Conclusions against Commentaries

Application

What does it mean to me? (after the first two are done)

- How does this apply to me?
- What truths are there for me to embrace?
- Are there changes that I need to make?
