• Read with a Purpose

Interpretation

What does it mean? (there is only one interpretation)

Interpretation (cont.)

- Context Rules
- Seek the Full Counsel of the Word of God
- Scripture will never contradict Scripture
- Don't base Doctrine on an Obscure Passage

Interpretation (cont.)

- Interpret Scripture Literally (Literarelly)
- Look for the Author's Intended Meaning
- Check Conclusions against Commentaries
