

Destruction Of The Temple 605 BC Ist Deportation / Temple Articles

In the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim king of Judah, Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon came to Jerusalem and besieged it.

Destruction Of The Temple

1st Deportation / Temple Articles

605 BC

And the Lord delivered Jehoiakim king of Judah into his hand, along with some of the articles from the temple of God. These he carried off to the temple of his god in Babylonia and put in the treasure house of his god. (Daniel 1:1-2 NIV) Historical Backdrop

Destruction Of The Temple597 BC2nd Deportation / Temple Plundered

During Jehoiakim's reign, Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon invaded the land, and Jehoiakim became his vassal for three years. But then he turned against Nebuchadnezzar and rebelled. (2 Kings 24:1 NIV)

Destruction Of The Temple 597 BC 2nd Deportation / Temple Plundered As the LORD had declared, Nebuchadnezzar removed the treasures from the temple of the LORD and from the royal palace, and cut up the gold articles that Solomon king of Israel had made for the temple of the LORD.

Destruction Of The Temple597 BC2nd Deportation / Temple Plundered

He carried all Jerusalem into exile: all the officers and fighting men, and all the skilled workers and artisans—a total of ten thousand. Only the poorest people of the land were left.

Destruction Of The Temple 597 BC 2nd Deportation / Temple Plundered

Nebuchadnezzar took Jehoiachin captive to Babylon. He also took from Jerusalem to Babylon the king's mother, his wives, his officials and the prominent people of the land. (2 Kings 24:13-15 NIV)

Destruction Of The Temple597 BC2nd Deportation / Temple Plundered

In my thirtieth year, in the fourth month on the fifth day, while I was among the exiles by the Kebar River, the heavens were opened and I saw visions of God.

Destruction Of The Temple 597 BC 2nd Deportation / Temple Plundered On the fifth of the month—it was the fifth year of the exile of King Jehoiachin — the word of the LORD came to Ezekiel the priest, the son of Buzi, by the Kebar River in the land of the Babylonians. There the hand of the LORD was on him. (Ezekiel 1:1-3 NIV) Historical Backdrop

Then the glory of the LORD departed from over the threshold of the temple and stopped above the cherubim. (Ezekiel 10:18 NIV)

Destruction Of The Temple 588 BC 2 Year Siege Of Jerusalem Now in the ninth year of his reign, on the tenth day of the tenth month, Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon came, he and all his army, against Jerusalem, camped against it, and built a siege wall all around it. Historical Backdrop

So the city was under siege until the eleventh year of King Zedekiah. On the ninth day of the fourth month the famine was so severe in the city that there was no food for the people of the land. (2 Kings 25:1-4 NIV)

I gave the same message to Zedekiah king of Judah. I said, "Bow your neck under the yoke of the king of Babylon; serve him and his people, and you will live.

"Why will you and your people die by the sword, famine and plague with which the LORD has threatened any nation that will not serve the king of Babylon? (Jeremiah 27:12-13 NIV)


Destruction Of The Temple 586 BC Destruction Of Temple And Jerusalem
